About the service this morning...

"As truly as God is Father, so just as truly is He our mother."

Today is mid-Lent Sunday, known as Mothering Sunday because of the ancient custom on that day for everyone to return to their mother church — the cathedral church of the area. For some, this would be the only time that the whole family could gather together. Nowadays a number of themes run through our Mothering Sunday service, which include: thanksgiving for all who undertake a mothering role and all who care for the young; recognising the pain that some carry through child-lessness or bereavement at the loss of a child or parent; thanksgiving for the part that the Virgin Mary played in our redemption; and prayers for the ministry of women in the worldwide church, who is 'mother to us all'.

Introduction

For many years the Fourth Sunday in Lent has been observed as *Mothering Sunday*. The tradition arose from a sentence in St Paul's Letter to the Galatians, which for many centuries was read in the Epistle of this Sunday: in it St Paul writes of "Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all".

So, on this day we give thanks to God who gives us New Birth, and for the Church which, like a mother, nurtures us in the life of the Spirit.

We also give thanks for our own human mothers, and for all the qualities of mothering, given and received in this congregation.
