

C.N.I. Day

The Church of North India (CNI) was established on 29th November 1970 by bringing together most of the Protestant churches working in northern India. It is a province of the worldwide Anglican Communion and a member of the World Methodist Council and the World Communion of Reformed Churches. The merger, which had been in discussions since 1929, came eventually between the Church of India, Pakistan, Burma and Ceylon (Anglican), the Methodist Church (British & Australian), Disciples of Christ, and some congregations from the United Church of Northern India.
