Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. "Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye," he said, "and then I will come with you.

Change or transition is hard, but we can face it bravely and powerfully with God's help. The transition in leadership from Elijah to Elisha reminds us that we can be obedient to what God is calling us to do without understanding all the details.

Elijah was one of the great prophets of the Old Testament, bold, daring, full of faith. Elisha succeeded Elijah. Elisha was an ordinary man who was living at home with his parents, working on a farm when God called him to do something incredible.

God is going to speak to somebody and give you the faith to believe that he's calling you to something new. You may be looking at oxen rears today, but in your faithfulness, God may call you to do something even greater for his kingdom. You have to have the faith to go and you don't have to understand fully to obey immediately. Those that God uses the most, are those who hold on to the least.

Will you trust and obey?

We give thanks to God for the life and work of Mr. David Long who passed away on Monday 14th July 2025. David was an alumnus of the Cathedral & John Connon School where he later returned to teach maths and science in the Middle School (2000 - 2009). He was also the Housemaster of Savage house. David began his teaching career in Christ Church School, Byculla. He then changed careers to become a bank officer with the State Bank of India and was posted in Panama.

David was a dedicated member of the Cathedral Choir. He was a boy chorister under the legendary Cathedral Organist & Choirmaster, Mr. Charles Velu. On his return to India, David sang in the bass section and was a pillar of the choir. Failing eyesight prevented him from doing what he liked best - singing in the choir stalls.

David leaves behind his wife Mrs. Nilima Long, son Rahul and sisters Liza and Sandra. We pray for God's comforting presence to be with the family at this time. Let us give thanks to God for David's faithful service through music, singing for the divine services in the Cathedral and for the many lives he impacted as a teacher in the Cathedral & John Connon School.
