The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you."

God promises Abraham that he would be the father of a large nation. Through Abraham and Sarah all the families of the earth shall be blessed. They will have an impact on people everywhere. So how does Abraham respond? Abraham and Sarah believed God's promise, so Abraham and Sarah went.

At the heart of Genesis 12 is the theme of journey which will form a central part of Israel's identity as a people on the move. Genesis 12:1- 4 speaks a powerful word today in those instances when we are called to leave all that is known behind; to depart on a journey without a map. The journey may be long, sometimes much longer than one may have thought. It is a journey with many ups and downs, many joys and sorrows. But it is a journey filled with many, many promises—the most important being the promise of God's presence to show us the way.

In 1718 he travelled to Tranquebar where he was baptised and Christened 'Aaron' by Bartholomaeus Ziegenbaig a pioneer of Protestant missionary activity in India.
