Welcome to St Thomas' Cathedral for this service

We are the mother church of the Diocese of Bombay in the Church of North India, a member of the worldwide Anglican Communion. Christian worship has been offered to God here for over 300 years. By worshipping with us today, you become part of that living tradition.

The basis for our worship is the *Book of Common Prayer*, our common liturgical heritage with Anglicans across the world (all churches descended from the Church of England). We are rooted in tradition but celebrate the richness and diversity of the Communion. Music and hymnody represent the best of the Anglican choral tradition.

We kindly request that you do not take photographs, or video or sound recording in the cathedral at any time during services. You are welcome to take photographs at any other time.

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SERVICE OF CONFIRMATION

Confirmation marks an important stage in the life of a Christian. The promises that have been made on behalf of an infant or child at baptism are now made by the baptised person him or herself. These promises are made before a bishop marking the relationship between all baptised people and the universal Church. Once promises have been made, the Bishop prays for the candidates and asks the Holy Spirit to bless them in their discipleship. In some traditions confirmation is linked with receiving communion for the first time. So today the newlyconfirmed candidates will receive communion before the rest of the congregation. At the end of the service we remind them of their baptism by sending them out with a lit candle to be God's light in the world.

Alvina Magar, Danika Pandian, Rebecca Baker, Kevin Gladstone, Sahiesh Ravichandran and Amos Rangayya will be confirmed by Bishop Manoj Charan at the service this morning.

Beloved in Christ, we have come together today in God's presence to do three things.

The first is to be present while each of those to be confirmed publicly accepts for himself or herself God's promise of salvation in Christ. You will be their witnesses that they have committed themselves to Christ, their Lord and Saviour.

Continued. Turn over.

The second is to support these candidates with your prayers. Especially we shall pray that through the laying on of hands in Confirmation each of them may increasingly experience the grace and power of God's Holy Spirit; for only so can they grow in the love of God and be true followers of Jesus Christ.

The third is that you, the members of the particular congregation to which they belong, may welcome them into the fellowship of those who share in the holy sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

The Bishop addresses the candidates

Those who brought you as a child for baptism made a solemn pledge that you would be nurtured in the Christian faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

You are here today in order that you may give your own assent to the pledge which was then made in your name.

You have come to declare your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, your acceptance of Him as your Saviour, and your commitment to Him for ever.

In your baptism each one of you was made a member of the body of Christ and was received into His Church, which is the family and household of God. You have now come to receive from God the spiritual gift which he has promised o those who believe in Him; for in accordance with the practice of the Apostles I shall lay my hand on each of you and pray that the Holy Spirit may strengthen you to follow Christ and to be His faithful witness.

The Bishop and people pray together

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, you have made us your children in Christ through your Holy Spirit in baptism.

Grant that, strengthened by our Spirit in Confirmation, we may share in the glorious liberty of your people and live as sons and daughters of your kingdom; through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you, Father, and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, world without end.

Amen.

The Epistle
Romans 8:11 - 17

Reader

Hear the word of God concerning the gift of the Holy Spirit, in the Letter of Paul the Apostle to the Church in Rome.

And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation—but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father." 

Service of Confirmation

The Profession of Personal Discipleship

The Presbyter reads outs the names of those who are being presented. Each candidate stands when his or her name is called.

The Bishop says to the candidates:

You who desire to be confirmed must first profess your allegiance to Christ and your rejection of all that is evil. You must have already counted the cost of being a disciple of Jesus Christ. He says, 'If you want to become my followers let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.' But He also promises that in His company no burden is too hard to bear.

Bishop Do you accept Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour?

Candidate: Yes, I do.

Bishop Do you therefore, renounce all that is evil?

Candidate: Yes, I do.

Bishop Will you follow Jesus Christ in the fellowship of His

Church?

Candidate: Yes, I will.

The Declaration of Faith

The Bishop says to the candidates:

You are determined to be true followers of Christ and to renounce all this evil. The power to do this is promised to those who hold fast to God in faith and hope.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in God the Father, who

created you and all the world?

The candidates say together:

Yes, I do.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ, who

has redeemed you and all people?

Candidates Yes, I do.

Bishop Do you believe and trust in His Holy Spirit, who renews

and transforms you and all the people of God?

Candidates Yes, I do.

The Promises

The Bishop says to the candidates

The sincerity of our faith is proved when it is active in love. I therefore urge you to make your daily life worthy of the Father of all who loves you and has made you His children, worthy of His Son who died for you, and worthy of His Spirit who dwells in you. Will you strive through regular prayer and reading of the Bible to grow in God's love and to learn His will for your life?

Candidates Yes, I will.

Bishop Will you strive to respond to this great love of God by a life

of joyful obedience to Him and of love and care for others?

Candidates Yes, I will.

Bishop Will you join as far as possible with your fellow Christians

in public worship on Sundays, and especially in the Lord's

Supper?

Candidates Yes, I will.

Bishop God calls His Church to share with all people the good

news of His love made known in Christ. Will you take your part in doing this?

Candidates I shall try with God's help

to make Christ known,

by what I am, by what I say,

by what I do for others.

The candidates and congregation kneel

Bishop Let us pray in silence that the Holy Spirit may enable you

to be faithful to your promises.

A moment of silence is kept, after which kneeling or seated all sing

Candidates led by the Bishop say:

O God, my Father, I am not my own but yours; I rely on your grace and the power of your Holy Spirit, and give myself to you as your child, to love and serve you all the days of my life.

The Confirmation

The Bishop administers Confirmation. Facing the candidates, he says:

The love of God is poured into our hearts,

All answer Through the Holy Spirit He has given us.

The Bishop and the Presbyters stretch out their hands towards those to be confirmed, and the Bishop says this prayer, in which the whole congregation joins.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, in baptism we were made you children and members of your Church by the water of rebirth and the renewing power of your Holy Spirit.

Grant now to these your children the fullness of the same Spirit, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and inward strength, the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness, and fill them, O Lord, with the Spirit of your holy fear.

The candidates to be confirmed come forward and kneel before the Bishop. The Presbyter announces the name of the candidates.
The Bishop lays his hand on the head of each candidate in turn, saying:

Strengthen, O Lord, your child (name) with your Holy Spirit.

After all the candidates have been confirmed, the Bishop says:

Defend, O Lord, these your children: make them strong with your heavenly grace, that they may continue yours for ever, and daily grow in your Holy Spirit more and more, Until they come to your everlasting kingdom.

All Amen.

Bishop:

Almighty and ever living God, we thank you for the great blessing bestowed on these your children through the laying on of hands. By this sign they are assured of your unfailing goodness towards them. We commit them to your fatherly care. Grant that they may serve you all the days of their life, and finally know the bliss of your eternal presence; through Jesus Christ, our Saviour. To Him, to you, Father, and to the Holy Spirit, one God in wisdom, power and love, we offer our thanks and praise, now and for ever.

God grant that we may together serve Him here on earth in the unity of the Spirit
